## Speaker Bios:

**Bill DeLong** was assigned as the PSA for the Maine District in April 2013. He has been involved in three Regional Resiliency Assessment Projects for DHS, one focused on the impacts of climate change on critical infrastructure in the Casco Bay Watershed, one focused on the vulnerabilities of large power transformers to extreme weather events, and one examining the interconnected electrical power systems between Quebec and New Brunswick and the northeastern United States. Bill was involved as a primary stakeholder for an RRAP focused on the energy sector and connections between Maine and New Brunswick while working for the Maine Emergency Management Agency (MEMA). He serves as the Region One Infrastructure Visualization Program coordinator and was a part of the Dependency Working Group/Pilot. He worked for MEMA for nearly six years, serving as the state's first critical infrastructure protection officer then as the homeland security division director. While on staff at MEMA, he also served on the State, Local, Tribal, Territorial Government Coordinating Council, chairing one of the Council's working groups. He also served as the state's Emergency Management Assistance Compact coordinator and served in various roles in the State EOC during disasters. Bill is a native of Burnsville, Minnesota, where he lived until joining the Navy in 1986. He retired from active duty in 2006 as Chief Petty Officer. Bill served at multiple duty stations ashore as well as temporary assignments aboard surface ships and with one aviation squadron in support of the national intelligence mission. He resides in Portland, Maine with his daughter, Maya, and their dog, Marshall.



**Joseph Lawless** is the Senior Transportation Security Specialist for The Edward Davis Company. Lawless was formerly the chief law enforcement and security officer for MassPort's maritime properties located in South Boston, East Boston, and Charlestown. While at MassPort, Lawless was in charge of development and implementation of policing, security and emergency planning strategies for all facilities including the Boston Fish Pier, Cruiseport Boston and Conley Container Terminal. Lawless is recognized as a security industry leader, both locally and nationally. Lawless served as the Chairman of the American Association of Port Authorities (AAPA) Security Advisory Committee, a position he has held since 2009. The AAPA is the principal voice of 160 public port authorities in the U.S., Canada, Latin America, and the Caribbean. He has testified before Congress on key issues involving port security. Lawless created and chairs the weekly Port Security Operations meeting, a public and private security collaborative, attended by representatives of over twenty different agencies and corporations. Lawless received the 2012 International Police 9/11 Medal for Extraordinary & Distinguished Lifetime Achievement in fighting terrorism and trans-national crime from the International Association of Airport and Seaport Police. Lawless has 37 years of law enforcement and security experience, including more than 13 years with the Massachusetts State Police Uniform Patrol, Criminal Investigations, and Executive Protection units. He came to Massport in 1993 overseeing all aspects of public safety. In this role he oversaw Logan Airport-based Troop F of the Massachusetts State Police. Lawless received his B.A. from Merrimack College located in Andover, Mass., and an M.A. from Boston University.
